ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT

Lynn Ahrens (b. October 1, 1948–) is a singer, songwriter, and lyricist best known for her work in musical theatre. She is an Academy Award and Golden Globe nominee and a council member of the Dramatists Guild of America, a co-founder of the Dramatists Guild Fellows Program, and a Lilly Award winner for lyrics. A longtime collaborator with Stephen Flaherty, she has written many musicals including *Once on This Island, Ragtime*, and *Anastasia*. She is the recipient of a Tony Award, Drama Desk Award, and Outer Critics Circle Award for the Broadway musical *Ragtime*. She also received the Oscar Hammerstein Award for Lifetime Achievement, and in 2015 she was inducted into the Theater Hall of Fame.

ABOUT THE COMPOSER

Stephen Flaherty (b. September 18th, 1960-) is a composer for theatre and film. He is a longtime collaborator of Lynn Ahrens. He composed the music for the Broadway musicals *Ragtime* (Tony, Drama Desk, OCC Awards, two Grammy nominations), *Seussical* (Grammy, Drama Desk nominations), *Once on This Island* (Tony nomination, Olivier Award, Best Musical) and *Rocky*. He is the recipient of a Tony Award and a Drama Desk Award and has been nominated for an Oscar, and multiple Grammy Awards.

(Founder/Artistic Director) is Westcoast Black Theatre Troupe's Founder & Artistic Director. He is a driving force in Florida's theatre scene. A graduate of Florida A&M

University, Nate founded Westcoast Black Theatre Troupe in 1999. He has written, composed, directed and performed in many shows, as an actor, singer, dancer and comedian. He works extensively in the community, training and mentoring youth in the performing arts. As a result of his outstanding contributions to young people, the Sarasota County Branch NAACP Youth Council recognized Nate as one of its 2012 Men of Valor. In the spring of 2013, he was inducted into the Community Video Archives Hall of Fame for his significant contributions to the arts and education. In 2015, Nate was recognized as a Champion of Diversity for the arts during the Biz (941) and La Guia magazines' Unity Awards Luncheon, and was honored with the prestigious Larry Leon Hamlin Producer Award during the National Black Theatre Festival in Winston-Salem, N.C., "for his contributions to Black theatre specifically and American theatre in general." In 2017, Goodwill Manasota named him a Community Ambassador of the Year. In 2018, the Arts and Cultural Alliance of Sarasota County honored Nate with the Arts Leadership Award for Artistic Achievement. In August

2022 he brought Soul Crooners, Featuring Sistas in the Name of Soul to the National Black Theatre Festival in Winston-Salem, N.C. — WBTT's fifth appearance there. In 2021 Nate received the Perfect Pitch Award from Key Chorale, which recognized him as a driving force in the arts and for his collaborations with other arts organizations, including American Roots: The Gospel Experience, a series of concert performances with WBTT performers and Key Chorale presented in three area churches in the fall of 2019. He was recently featured in *The New York* Times, highlighting his mentorship and leadership, as well as WBTT's community outreach.



JIM WEAVER* (Director/ Choreographer) is thrilled to be WBTT's Education Director and Artistic Associate. A longtime WBTT guest director, Jim helped celebrate the opening of the Donelly Theatre in




ACTORS' EQUITY ASSOCIATION
